Steps for Registration

- 1. KASEP class descriptions and registration packet go home with on Tuesday, September 2.
- 2. Parents fill out lottery slip and return to the KCC office in the Recreation Building before 9 a.m. Tuesday, September 9. Please note that we've included two lottery slips: one for kindergarten students and one for grades 1–6.
- 3. KCC staff post results of lottery drawing for kindergarten and grades 1–6 by 3 p.m. on Wednesday, September 10. Results are posted on the exterior door of Room 3 of the Kensington Community Center (Youth Hut), on the vestibule door of the Recreation Building, and online at <u>www.kaseplottery.com</u>.
- 4. Registration begins for kindergarten students at 6:45 p.m. and at 7:15 p.m. for grades 1–6 in the Community Center. Names are called in the order drawn in the lotteries.

Some frequently asked questions about registration:

I can't attend registration-how do I sign up for classes?

Another family can list you on their lottery slip and sign up for both families at registration. They cannot register for you if your name is not on their lottery slip. You can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office. <u>Only one lottery slip</u> should be submitted for two families registering together.

Can I register if I forgot to submit a lottery slip?

You can come to registration and receive a number that follows the numbers given out through the lottery. As above, you can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office.

What happens if I arrive at registration after my name has been called?

You'll need to get a "walk-in" number and wait until the rest of the lottery numbers have been called.

Do I need to fill out any paper work before registration?

Please fill out the top section of the registration form and bring it with you to registration. The registrar will fill in classes for you at the bottom of the sheet, so please leave this part blank. You'll find a separate worksheet in the packet that you can use to jot down first and second choices for classes.

May I register if I owe money for a previous session?

No, you may not sign up for classes on registration night. Please come by the KCC office to clear your account. You may register in the office for classes with openings.

Do I need a lottery number to sign up for gymnastics and karate ?

No, you may sign up for any of these classes directly without having a lottery number. The sign-up tables for those classes will be in a side room off of the main community room during registration.

Can I pay by credit card?

We're hoping to add this option in the future, but KCC currently can only accept cash or checks.

Important information for all kasep parents <u>SIGN-OUT PROCEDURES</u>

On the registration form there will be a place to check and sign a waiver which allows your child to leave KASEP classes on his or her own. If you do not sign this waiver, you or whomever you have assigned are required to come into the classroom and sign the child out before he or she may leave. <u>Students with permission to leave on their own may only leave at the end of the class</u>.

The KASEP staff is making every effort to be sure that all students are signed out before leaving the classroom, but it is important that we have your cooperation to insure that (1) you or a person that you have assigned always signs out before taking the child from the classroom, and (2) you talk with your child about not leaving the classroom or the area just outside the classroom until you or the assigned person comes to pick him or her up. To change the child's status in the middle of a session, you need to sign a new form in the KCC office and also alert the appropriate KASEP teachers so they can change the sign-out procedure for your child in their roll books.

THE BIGGEST HELP PARENTS CAN GIVE US IS TO BE ON TIME OR EVEN A LITTLE EARLY TO PICK UP THEIR CHILD.

If you have given written permission for your child to leave the classroom on his or her own, your child should know where they are supposed to go after class.

For students in grades 1–6, KASEP is responsible only after they check in at their KASEP class. Parents are responsible for providing any required assistance to ensure that their children find their way from school to KASEP classes. If parents do not think their child is able to independently get to KASEP classes, they should consider waiting until their child is older to start KASEP classes. Please let us know if your child will be missing their KASEP class.

KINDERGARTEN PARENTS

In order to provide enrichment classes to all kindergartners, KASEP offers <u>before school</u> enrichment classes for PM kindergartners Monday through Friday, as well as after school classes for AM kindergartners every day.

The PM kindergartners taking a <u>before school</u> KASEP class should arrive at 10:15 am for their KASEP class (see class descriptions for location of classes). KASEP teachers will teach their class and will then walk students up to their kindergarten classroom. KASEP teachers will arrive at the kindergarten classroom in time to pick up the AM kindergartners. Once the PM kindergartners have gone into the classroom, the KASEP teachers will walk the AM kindergarten group down, supervise lunch and teach their class. After the class, those children must be picked up at their class site by parents or assigned caregivers.

For more than twenty years, KASEP has been a tremendously successful after school enrichment program for our children, thanks to a hard-working staff, quality teaching and the continued support of parents and the community. Over the years, KASEP has received requests for price reductions from families who cannot afford the fees. In an effort to make our classes available to more students, we are offering four partial scholarships each session.

Scholarships are limited to one scholarship per family per session. Scholarships are 80% for students eligible for the free lunch program; 50% for students eligible for the reduced lunch program or demonstrated need. A space will be guaranteed for the class chosen. Applications will be processed first come, first served with a waiting list of up to four names for the following session. The waiting list will not be carried over the summer. All application information is kept confidential.

We raise money for scholarships through our bake sales and through donations at registration. We greatly appreciate the generosity of our community in making scholarship funds available.

Kasep Registration – Fall 2008

- 1. <u>Your registration packet</u> should contain:
 - a. KASEP Policy (See Reverse)
 - b. Registration Form and Worksheet for Registration
 - c. Schedule of classes and description of classes
- 2. <u>Payment</u>
 - a. Payment is due at registration. Make checks payable to K.C.C.
 - b. Payment can be made in two installments, but a minimum of 50% of the total must be paid at registration.
- 3. <u>No refunds</u> will be given if a class is dropped after the first week .
- 4. <u>Priority for registration</u>:
 - KASEP committee members will receive priority for registration; members serve voluntarily and are rewarded in this way for time invested.
- 5. <u>General information</u>
 - a. Registration is <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 10th at 6:45 pm for Kindergarten and</u> <u>7:15 pm for Grades 1-6</u> in the Kensington Community Center main room.
 - b. One registration form must be used for each child, but you should only submit one lottery slip per family, <u>unless submitting separate slips for kindergarten</u> <u>and grades 1–6 registration.</u>
 - c. You may register for children in your own family and one additional family only. <u>Two families registering together should submit only one lottery slip</u>.
 - d. During registration, families <u>cannot</u> ask a family with a lower lottery number to register for them.
 - e. You will be notified <u>only</u> if your child's class has been cancelled.
- 5. <u>Waiting list</u>: Children who do not get into a class because it is already full have the option of being placed on a waiting list. Up to 50% of the class for the following session will be taken from this list, according to the order of sign-up. Children on more than one waiting list can only pre-register for one class, which applies only to the following session. The waiting list does <u>not</u> carry over to the next school year.
- 6. <u>Minimum Day cards</u>: A Minimum Day card, available only to KASEP students, provides supervision for your child on minimum days (<u>NOT for early dismissal on</u> <u>Wednesdays</u>) from minimum day dismissal time until the start of the first KASEP classes. The card costs \$20, can be purchased at the KASEP office or at registration, and is valid all year. If you do not purchase this card, your children will be unsupervised and KASEP will not be responsible for them during that time.
- 7. Please check age requirements to be sure your child is the right age for the class.

Policy

PRICE OF CLASSES, REFUNDS AND CLASS CANCELLATION POLICY

Please note that the variation in class fees is due to several factors, including the number of weeks that the class meets during the session, the length of the class, and the class size. This Fall, there are KASEP holidays on Friday, October 17, Tuesday, November 4, Tuesday, November 11 and Thursday–Friday, November 27–18. Monday and Wednesday classes will meet 13 weeks, Tuesday, and Friday classes will meet 11 weeks, and Thursday classes will meet 12 weeks.

Students may drop a class in the first week. There will be a non-refundable processing fee of 10% of the class cost for any class dropped. No refunds are given for students who drop out of class after the first week. The rationale behind this policy is as follows: The KASEP Program operates on a break-even financial budget that requires a minimum number of students in each class. If a parent withdraws a child from a particular class, KASEP has lost the opportunity to fill the class with another student. If a refund were made, the class would not break even and the program would be in jeopardy.

Our break-even financial budget necessitates a minimum class size. When that size is not met, parents may be asked whether they would be willing to pay more in order to avoid cancellation of the class. If a class is cancelled due to low enrollment, a full refund will be given.

If parents have not paid in full for all previous KASEP classes, they will not be eligible for the lottery or KASEP classes until they have paid their outstanding balance.

FOR INFORMATION ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS, CONTACT THE KCC OFFICE.

ATTENDANCE:

Parents must notify KASEP (525-0292 message machine) if a child will be absent.

Each teacher takes attendance every day and gives the roll immediately to the Afternoon Supervisor, who then checks unaccounted absences against the school roster for the day. If the child is still not accounted for, the Afternoon Supervisor will call the parents' home and work numbers. If there is no answer, she will call the emergency numbers listed on the child's registration form. Should calling all available numbers prove fruitless, a call to the Kensington Police will be made if the parent has given authorization to do so.

<u>AFTER CLASS</u>: Please read brochure page titled IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL KASEP PARENTS regarding sign-out procedures. Parents or guardians are encouraged to pick up their children promptly at the end of the class period. Parents will be charged a \$15 late fee for each fifteen minutes or part thereof that they are late.

<u>DISCIPLINE</u>: Our program is designed to offer quality classes to children after school. Disciplinary problems disrupt the classes and affect the quality of the teaching. The parent or guardian of a child who has disciplinary problems will be notified on the first offense in an attempt to enlist the parent or guardian's help in correcting the problem. A second offense will result in the child being permanently dismissed from the class. Any behavior deemed by the teacher to be dangerous will result in the immediate dismissal of the student. The parent will be notified of any action taken. In a case of disciplinary dismissal, no refund will be given for the same reasons stated above under "Refunds".
