Steps for Registration

- 1. KASEP Winter brochures go home to families Monday, November 28th.
- 2. Parents fill out lottery slip and return to the KCC office in the Recreation Building before 9 am Monday, December 5th. Please note that weive included two lottery slips: one for kindergarten students and one for grades 1-6.
- 3. KCC staff post results of lottery drawings (one for kindergarten students and one for grades 1-6) by 3pm on Tuesday, December 6th. Results are posted at the Kensington Community Center, at the Recreation Building, and online at: www.aboutkensington.com/kasep
- 4. Registration begins for kindergarten students at 6:45pm and at 7:15pm for grades 1-6 in the Community Center. Names are called in the order drawn in the lotteries. During registration, families <u>cannot</u> ask a family with a lower lottery number to register for them.

Some frequently asked questions about registration:

- I canít attend registrationóhow do I sign up for classes?
- Another family can list you on their lottery slip and sign up for both families registration. They cannot register for you if your name is not on their lottery slip. You can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office. Only one lottery slip should be submitted for two families registering together.
- Can I register if I forgot to submit a lottery slip?

 You can come to registration and receive a number that follows the numbers given out through the lottery. As above, you can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office.
- What happens if I arrive at registration after my name has been called?

 You'll need to get a iwalk-ini number and wait until the rest of the lottery numbers have been called.
- Do I need to fill out any paper work before registration?

 Please fill out the top section of the registration form and bring it with you to registration. Remember to sign the waiver and the areas on the registration form that ask for a signature. The registrar will fill in classes for you at the bottom of the sheet, so please leave this part blank. You'll find a separate worksheet in the packet that you can use to jot down first and second choices for classes.

May I register if I owe money for a previous session?

No, you may not sign up for classes at registration. Please come by the KCC office to clear your account. You may register in the office for classes with openings.

Do I need a lottery number to sign up for gymnastics and karate?

No, you may sign up for karate directly without having a lottery number.

Please call Judy Baker at 233-1833 for questions about gymnastics. Call the Shotokan Institute at 526-8334 for information about karate.

Can I pay by credit card?

KCC currently can only accept cash or checks.

Should I pack a snack for my child?

You can always send a snack along with your child. Whether snacks are provided in a class is at the discretion of the teacher. If your child has any food allergies or special food requirements and you want them to have a snack, you need to provide a snack from home. Also, please let KASEP know about any food allergy issues or special food requirements for your child.

Will outdoor classes be held on rainy days?

Yes, we have assigned rooms for indoor games and activities on rainy days. Please consult the class description in the brochure for the specific room. Also, please note that the rainy day rooms vary by day since we have many classes during the week.

REFUNDS

Students may drop a class in the first week. There will be a non-refundable processing fee of 10% of the class cost for any class dropped. No refunds are given for students who drop out of class after the first week.

CLASS PRICES

Please note that the variation in class fees is due to several factors, including the number of weeks that the class meets during the session, the length of the class, and the class size. With holidays in the Winter, the classes will meet 8 Mondays, 10 Tuesdays, 10 Wednesdays, 10 Thursdays and 10 Fridays.

LATE PICKUP FEE

Parents will be charged a \$15 late fee for each fifteen minutes or part thereof that they are late.

DISCIPLINE

Our program is designed to offer quality classes to children after school. Disciplinary problems disrupt the classes and affect the quality of the teaching. On the first occasion of a disciplinary problem, the parent or guardian of a child will be called in an attempt to enlist the parent or guardian's help in correcting the behavior. A second offense may result in the child being permanently dismissed from the class. Any behavior deemed by the teacher to be dangerous will result in the immediate dismissal of the student. The parent will be notified of any action taken. In a case of disciplinary dismissal, no refund will be given.

WAITING LIST

Once a class is full, children will be placed on a waiting list. The first two names on the waiting list for each class will have the opportunity to preregister for that class the following session. Children on more than one waiting list may only preregister for one class, which applies only to the following session. The waiting list does <u>not</u> carry over to the next school year.
