Steps for Registration

Please fill out your registration form(s) before coming to registration. Include the names and phone numbers of two additional people to be contacted in case of an emergency. We can't complete your registration if the form hasn't been filled out completely. Your cooperation will expedite the registration process for everyone.

1. KASEP Spring brochures go home to families the week of February 25th.

2. Parents fill out lottery slip and return to the KCC office in the Recreation Building before 11am Monday, March 11th. Please note that weive included two lottery slips: one for kindergarten students and one for grades 1–6.

- Lottery results will be posted (one for kindergarten students and one for grades 1-6) by 11am on Tuesday, March 12th. Results are posted at the Kensington Community Center, at the Recreation Building, and online at: <u>www.AboutKensington.com</u>
- 4. Registration begins for kindergarten students at 6:45pm and at 7:15pm for grades 1-6 in the Community Center. Names are called in the order drawn in the lotteries. During registration, families <u>cannot</u> ask a family with a lower lottery number to register for them.

Some frequently asked questions about registration:

I can't attend registration—how do I sign up for classes?

Another family can list you on their lottery slip and sign up for both families at registration. They cannot register for you if your name is not on their lottery slip. You can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office. <u>Only one lottery slip</u> should be submitted for two families registering together.

- Can I register if I forgot to submit a lottery slip? You can come to registration and receive a number that follows the numbers given out through the lottery. As above, you can also sign up for any spaces left in classes after registration in the KCC office.
- What happens if I arrive at registration after my name has been called? You'll need to get a iwalk-inî number and wait until the rest of the lottery numbers have been called.

A word or two about our kasep teachers

LANCE AKIYAMA [Workshop for Young Engineers] has been working with children for the past five years in various settings including a LEGO camp, Spectrum Center, multiple summer and after school programs, and as a volunteer at the El Cerrito High School's health center. He aspires to expand The Workshop to reach more children throughout the Bay Area.

TATI ARGUE [Hip Hop] holds a BA in English from UC Berkeley. She has taught children and adults in both academic and fitness settings for ten years. She is currently a staff fitness instructor at the YMCA and has taught kids' classes in tumbling, Hip Hop and other dance forms there. She also teaches dance privately at her home studio. By day she is a preschool teacher.

ELAINE CHU [Art and Bookmaking] loves teaching book arts and has exhibited in various craft shows. She has worked as a graphic designer and piano instructor internationally. She has a B.A. in music from Yale University and a B.F.A. in graphic design from University of the Arts in Philadelphia.

SHELLY COURNOYER [Mask Making; Jewelry Making] received her Bachelor of Fine Arts from California College of the Arts. For the past two years, she has been a faculty member in the Jewelry Department at the Richmond Art Center, teaching adults metalsmithing and a variety of specialty technique courses. Shelly taught a jewelry class for elementary students in Piedmont and has assisted at the Crucible in the youth blacksmithing program. This will be Shelly's second year at KASEP.

LYNN CROOK [Sewing]. a former middle-school educator, has been teaching sewing at KASEP since 1996. She began sewing her own clothes in high school and college. When her children went to school in Berkeley, Lynn started working on their school raffle quilts. Winning awards for her own quilts, she is now rewarded while teaching sewing skills to children at KASEP.

CAROLYN HOLM [Everyday Art] is a collage and assemblage artist, and the author of <u>Everyday</u> <u>Art for Kids</u>. She is also a former Kensington Hilltop parent, and created the annual Family Art Night at the school.

CATHERINE "CRICKET" JOHNSON [Yoga; Creative Drama] is a performance artist, an educator and also a certified Kundalina Yoga instructor who has practiced and taught yoga for over 20 years to people of all ages.With two children at Hilltop, she is grateful to serve the community through teaching in the KASEP program.

JAN JONES [Keyboard] has taught music at Madera Elementary since 1984 and Kensington Hilltop since 1994. She is a professional musician--an accomplished performer, an innovative composer/arranger and a skilled instructor. Jan has taught music including singing, keyboard, piano and recorder to children and adults for more than 25 years. She is patient, knowledgeable, and loves to teach. CHRIS LACK [Critter Adventures; Pottery] works both as a gardener/designer and as a teacher. He has degrees from California College of the Arts and San Francisco State University in Fine Arts. He has been a practicing landscape worker/designer for over twenty years in this area, and has taught many classes during that time as well. Nature, pottery and garden works are near to Chris' heart, and his interest in them comes through in all of his classes.

LISSETTE LOPEZ [Spanish; Cooking], a graduate of San Francisco State University with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, has worked for the past five years in an after school program, creating engaging activities to motivate learning in the children's classes. She uses hands-on activities to encourage exploration and creativity. She plans to use these same techniques to teach both Spanish and Cooking in our program.

SHELLY OUYANG (Mandarin) joined KASEP in October, replacing Xinrong Searcy as our Mandarin instructor. Shelly holds a Master's Degree in Chemical Engineering from Xinjiang University in China and came to the United States in 2004 to complete her Master's Degree in Finance and Economics. Today, Shelly enjoys being a mom and teaching Chinese. She comes to us from Cornell Chinese School in Albany, CA. Shelly enjoys integrating teaching Chinese with language, stories and children's songs. She has volunteered helping students learn Chinese characters, daily dialogue, words and sentence structure.

Art and Bookmaking for Kindergartners

Instructor: Elaine Chu Recreation Building Room C Tuesdays 11:30-1:00 (1 hour 30 minute class) Grade: Kindergarten Class Size: 6-7 Cost: \$160 9 week session

Kindergartners can get creative with hands-on art and bookmaking projects. They develop fine motor skills, an appreciation for the arts and crafts, and an inspired sense of accomplishment. Fun projects include pop-up animal books, 3-D medieval castles, felt pamphlets featuring planets and stars, accordion books with pockets, and more. New projects are offered throughout the year.

Carpentry for Kindergartners

From the very beginning of teaching carpentry to kindergartners, I was never interested in just playing around with wood. I wanted these young carpenters to learn to use real tools and to make real projects, in a safe and supportive environment. To my continuing delight, these five- and six-year-olds are able to make a wide variety of projects of ever-increasing complexity. They learn problem solving, coordination skills, and even some basic math. They have fun and are always proud to take their amazing projects home to enjoy for years to come.

Creative Drama for Kindergartners

Instructor: Catherine iCricketî Johnson Community Center Room 1 Thursdays 1:05-2:00 (55 minute class) Grade: Kindergarten Class Size: 6-7 Cost: \$125 (materials included) 9 week session

Creative Drama is an important means of stimulating creativity and provides an outlet for emotions, thoughts, and dreams that children might not otherwise have means to express. In this class we will combine spoken language with imagination, to imitate, and to pretend to be someone or something else. We will play theater games and use improvisation and costumes to create silliness. We will connect and project individually and as an ensemble. Mostly the class is about having fun!

Critter Adventures for Kindergartners
