NEW POLICY FOR REPEAT ENROLLMENTS DURING ON-LINE REGISTRATION.

Our intention is to give everyone an opportunity to enroll in one of the four highly desirable/impacted classes, which include: Carpentry, Critter Adventures for Kindergartners, Pottery, and Engineering.

If you were enrolled in Carpentry, Engineering, Pottery, or Critter Adventures for Kindergarten in the FALL, you cannot enroll in Carpentry in WINTER but can jump back in during the SPRING session.

TIP – good to know: Carpentry, Critter Adventures, Pottery and Engineering – if there is space available after everyone on the waitlist is called and given the opportunity to enroll, and there is still space available, you may enroll. Check in with the KCC office one week after the start of registration.

THIS POLICY DOES NOT APPLY TO ALL KASEP CLASSES - music, language, sports, cooking, singing, keyboard, or art classes. You may enroll in any of these classes, in each session, on a space available basis.

MINIMUM DAYS:

There is one minimum day in Winter KASEP, Open House on Thursday, March 20th. Supervision for your child for the 40 minutes between end of school and start of KASEP classes costs \$2.00/per child.

Students get out earlier this day. KASEP's service is to provide supervision for your child - bridging the gap between when school lets out and when the first KASEP classes begin (about 40 minutes),

This is an optional service to supervise your child during this time-gap. The charge is \$2.00 per child. You can pay for this service on-line during registration. This does NOT include the typical on-going Wednesday minimum days. On Wednesdays, our KASEP classes start earlier.

PHOTO RELEASE

Occasionally KCC may take photos of students or their work and publish it in the Outlook, our local newspaper or online as part of our brochure and for public relations purposes. We will not publish the names of students.

CLASS PRICES

KASEP class prices include credit card fees, materials fees and instructor fees. The price of the class varies based on the number of weeks the class meets during the session.

Winter KASEP is a 10 week session: 9 Mondays, 10 Tuesdays, 10 Wednesdays, 10 Thursdays and 10 Fridays.

WAITLIST

Once a class is fully enrolled, you may put your child on the waitlist for that class. No payment is required when you are waitlisted. If there is a cancellation, the first person on the waitlist will be called and given 24 hours to respond. The waitlist will accept 5 names.

TIP- good to know! The first two names on the waitlist for each class will have the opportunity to pre-register for that class the following session. Children on more than one waitlist may only register for one class. Waitlist does not carry over to the next school year.

SCHOLARSHIP DONATIONS

KASEP offers 50 different classes per week for children ages 5–12. The Scholarship Donation Fund offers access to families who would not otherwise have the opportunity to enroll in a KASEP class without your generosity and kindness.

It is only with your financial support that KCC can sustain this commitment to help provide scholarships to others. Donations are accepted by check, cash or credit card.

Scholarships are available for KASEP classes. KCC awards 4 scholarships per session. To apply for a scholarship, contact KCC/KASEP office, 510-525-0292. Deadline for Winter Scholarship Applications is Friday, December 13.

<u>PAYMENT</u>

KASEP classes are filled on a space available basis, first come first serve. All classes require you to register before the first day of instruction.

Payment is due at registration. We accept credit cards on-line and cash and checks in the office. Please make checks payable to K.C.C. Payments can be made in two installments, but a minimum of 50% of each class must be paid at registration.

- ✓ Credit Card: We accept Visa, MasterCard and Discover
- Check: Please make checks payment to KCC and write class title and child's name on check. A \$25.00 fee will be charge for all returned checks.

If you owe money from a previous session, you cannot enroll in KASEP until your outstanding balance is paid.

CREDIT AND REFUND POLICY

Classes not meeting the minimum required enrollment, will be cancelled and the enrollment fee will be refunded by check.

Students may drop a class the first week. There is a non-refundable processing fee of \$25.00 for any class dropped. Withdrawal reimbursement will be sent by check.

No refunds are given for students who drop out of class after the first week.

Credit: students who withdraw from a KASEP class the first week can request a user credit. This credit may be applied to future KASEP enrollments. Credit is valid for 6 months. The \$25 fee for withdrawal will not be applied to user credits.
